**ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION, FALL 2016**

The focus of Supper at St John's this fall will be the Alpha Course. Classes run from **Sept. 21 through Dec. 14, with no class on Nov. 23.**

Alpha is built around three ideas: Food, a series of Talks, and Discussion.

**Food:** We will begin each session at 6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall with a delicious "church-cooked" meal and fellowship.

**A Series of Talks:** At 6:50 PM we will watch a 30-minute video lecture, presented by author and priest Nicky Gumbel. Each talk looks at a different question of the Christian faith, including "Who is Jesus?" "How can we have faith?" "How does God Guide Us?" "Does God Heal Today?" If you have attended Alpha previously, this is a new, updated program that will build on your previous experience.

**Discussion:** At the end of the talk, we will break into small groups for discussion. Each participant will be assigned to a group for the entire 12 weeks. The purpose of the small group is to discuss the talk and questions arising from it. These discussions will be around 30 minutes, concluding promptly at 8:00 PM.

We are hoping that everyone attending dinner will be able to participate, therefore we are providing activities for youth and child care for children so that parents can attend.
