A SPECIAL BENEVOLENCE ANNOUNCEMENT

Last year, \$55,000 was taken from the Wellington Fund in order to re-side the church building. In keeping with St. John's commitment to mission, 25% of that amount was set aside for ministry outside the life of our church (actually just over 25%, based on a somewhat complicated but necessary and accurate formula). Rather than dividing it up to support many different ministries, the Session decided to give the entire amount to one ministry where it could make a significant and lasting impact. After much research, discussion, and prayerful discernment by our Outreach Committee, the Session voted on Monday night to give \$18,333 to Cornerstone Christian Academy in Philadelphia. St. John's has a longstanding relationship with Cornerstone, with many of our members giving their time and energy as volunteers and mentors there. Cornerstone will use the funds toward their goals of hiring a school nurse, initiating a breakfast program, and improving their physical education program. Cornerstone is providing amazing ministry to the children of southwest Philadelphia, and we are so excited to be able to partner with them in such meaningful ways!
