UKRAINE RELIEF

As the number of Ukrainian refugees continues to increase by the day, food and other supplies inside Ukraine are becoming increasingly scarce. Churches and ecumenical partners who are already there are helping to provide basic items for survival for the millions who have been displaced. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing direct funding for these partners who are on the ground. St. John's Outreach Committee is donating \$10,000 towards this effort, and they would like to challenge the congregation to match this amount! (We have already received \$4,800...almost halfway to the goal!) The Synod of the Trinity will also be matching all funds through the presbytery. "Mary Magdala's Easter Prayer" by Ron Rolheiser

I never suspected resurrection to be so painful to leave me weeping With Joy

to have met you, alive and smiling,

outside an empty tomb

With Regret

not because I've lost you but because I've lost you in how I *had* you—in understandable, touchable, kissable, clingable flesh not as fully Lord, but as graspably human.

I want to cling, despite your protest cling to your body cling to your (and my) clingable humanity cling to what we had, our past.

But I know that...if I cling you cannot ascend and I will be left clinging to your former self ...unable to receive your present spirit.
