ST. JOHN'S OUTREACH PARTNER – CHOC, NORRISTOWN

Each month we highlight one of our mission partners, pray for the work that they do, and send them a letter of support signed by the congregation. This month we are focusing on the Coordinated Homeless Outreach Center (CHOC) in Norristown. CHOC is the only year-round, 24/7, emergency housing service for single adults experiencing homelessness in Montgomery County. CHOC's two wings include a day center where clients can meet with a caseworker, receive their mail, wash their clothes, apply for benefits, or attend group meetings; the smaller wing is a 50 to 80-bed overnight shelter. In addition to emergency shelter, CHOC provides street outreach, service counseling, transportation, rapid rehousing, meals, clothing, life skills and benefits counseling.
