# **COVID PRECAUTIONS**

If the number of worshippers exceeds our ability to do that, we will begin filling in the open pews as necessary. We will not be passing offering plates. Instead, offering baskets are located at each of the entrances to the sanctuary, and you can place your offering there on your way in.

# COMMUNION NEXT SUNDAY

Next Sunday (October 3) is World Communion Sunday, and we will be sharing the Lord's Supper with our brothers and sisters in Christ all around the world! If you are worshipping here, you will receive a bag with a piece of bread (gluten/nut-free is available) and a pre-sealed cup of juice on your way into the sanctuary. If you are worshipping at home via livestream, please be sure to have some bread and grape juice (or wine) on hand. However you are worshipping, we hope that you will share with us in this meal that reminds us of our unity in the one body of Christ.

# THE FALL FESTIVAL – TODAY (4–6:30 PM)

The Fall Festival will be held today from 4:00–6:30 PM. It will be outside (weather permitting) with no masks required, although you are certainly welcome to wear one, based on your level of comfort. There will be music, food, games, and "Oliver Rocks" rock painting for all ages! This year we are starting the rock painting at 4 PM to allow for plenty of time and daylight. As always, children are welcome, as we have games planned for them, too! Around 5 PM, food and drinks will be served by our masked and gloved volunteers. Come catch up with friends and spend a couple of hours of worry-free fun with us! Admission is \$5 per person with maximum of \$15 per family (guests are free). Volunteers are still needed to set up tables and chairs, clean up, and serve food and drinks. We hope that you will join us!

### SUNDAY SCHOOL

Children in Pre-K through 4<sup>th</sup> grade are invited to join us for in-person Sunday School during worship. Nursery care is available for younger children. Youth in grades 5–12 have the option to stay in worship or help with Sunday School downstairs.
