WELCOME TO THE REV. DR. SALLY A. BROWN

Our guest preacher this morning is the Rev. Dr. Sally A. Brown, who is recently retired from Princeton Seminary, and now lives in West Chester. She has been a professor of preaching and worship for 25 years. Prior to that, she spent 18 years in parish and non-parish ministries in the PCUSA in Plainfield, NJ, and Bethlehem, PA. In her first years after seminary, she served on the Student Life staff at Eastern University and chose St John's as her home church. She was ordained here in this sanctuary on September 28, 1980, only the second woman to be ordained by the Presbytery of Donegal. Back then, it was a progressive step on the part of this congregation and its Session – one for which she is ever grateful! Please welcome Rev. Dr. Brown back to her church home!
